In English, we want to elevate our writing beyond the simple and up to the complex and exciting. The perfect balance of details and description helps the reader to visualize our story and follow along instead of being lost and confused.

Rather than simply telling our reader about the feelings and events, it is our duty as writers to SHOW them.
